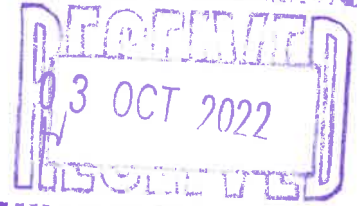

WHEREAS, Section 447 (5)(iv) of the Local Government Code of 1991 states "(iv) regulate the preparation and sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables, fruits, fresh dairy products and other foodstuffs for public consumption";

WHEREAS, the Local Government Unit established a new public market located at the Reclamation Area, Barangay Poblacion in our municipality;

WHEREAS, stalls are mounted inside the market which are intended for meat, fish as well as fruit/vegetable section;

WHEREAS, in order to improve the quality of commerce in our town, it is deemed necessary mandating all meat vendors and fish vendors to display and sell their goods or products only at the designated section at the New Public Market;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte in session assembled hereby enact the following

RESOLVED, as it is hereby RESOLVED, to enact the following:

ORDINANCE NO. 22-09

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING ALL MEAT AND FISH VENDORS TO DISPLAY AND SELL THEIR GOODS OR PRODUCTS ONLY AT DESIGNATED AREA AT THE NEW PUBLIC MARKET IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF INOPACAN, PROVINCE OF LEYTE, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES



(ordinance no. 22-09 of the sangguniang bayan of inopacan, leyte dated September 27, 2022, continued)

BE IT ORDAINED by the 15TH Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte that;

SECTION 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known as "The Wet Market Display Ordinance of the Municipality of Inopacan".

SECTION 2. Definition of terms – For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean and construed as:

2.1. New Public Market – a building or structure owned and operated by Municipal Government of Inopacan located at Reclamation Area of Barangay Poblacion. It is dedicated to the service of the public in general where basic food items and commodities are displayed and offered for sale.

2.2. Vendor – refers to a natural person who sells goods as a means of livelihood;

2.3. Wet Market – refers to stalls in Public Market where most of the commodities for sale are readily perishable foods. It shall be classified into five sections depending on the kind of goods offered for sale.

2.3.1. Meat Section – stalls that sell meat, beef pork, and dressed chicken.

2.3.2. Fish Section – stalls that sell fish, clam, oysters, shrimps, squid, crabs, lobster, seaweeds and other marine products.

2.3.3 Dried and Salted Fish Section - stalls where dried and salted fish are offered for sale

2.3.4 Vegetable Section – refers to stalls where leafy and fruit vegetables offered for sale

2.3.5 Fruit Section – refers to stalls where all kind of fruits shall be sold

2.4. Barangay Linao – in this proposed Ordinance, it refers to Sitio Bacong-bacong up to *felis-mini* Bridge, excluding Sitio Batuan.

SECTION 3. The New Public Market located at Reclamation Area, Barangay Poblacion, Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte is hereby designated as the Wet Market that offers various kinds of goods or products for sale.

SECTION 4. Prohibited Acts.

4.1. Selling of meat, pork, beef chicken, fish and other wet products and/or commodities outside premises of the New Public Market.

4.2 Vending/Selling in public places along Barangay Tao-taon, Poblacion, Tinago and Linao.

SECTION 5. Exemptions. Private owners and leased owners from private person/s shall be exempted in the implementation of this Ordinance for as long as they shall meet the standard requirements imposed by the Municipal Government upon application or renewal of business permits.

SECTION 6. The Municipal Treasurer's Office is hereby mandated to conduct survey and inspection for implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. Penalty Clause. The following Administrative Penalties shall be imposed to the vendor for violation of this Ordinance:

- First Offense - Fine of Php 1,000.00
- Second Offense - Fine of Php 1,500.00
- Third Offense - Fine of Php 2,500.00

SECTION 8. Compromise Penalty. The Municipal Treasurer is hereby authorized to enter compromise settlement as mutually agreed upon by both parties.


SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. All Ordinances, Local Chief Executive Order and/or Rules and Regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and modified accordingly.

SECTION 10. Separability Clause. If for any reason or reasons, any Section or Provision of this Ordinance will be declared by the court unconstitutional or invalid, other Sections or Provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and in effect.


SECTION 11. Effectivity Clause. This ordinance shall take effect after three (3) consecutive weeks of publication by way of posting copies in conspicuous place in the Municipal Building, Public Market and in all Barangay Halls of Inopacan.



MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE OF THE 15TH SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF INOPACAN, LEYTE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2022 AT THE SB SESSION HALL, NEW TOWN HALL, INOPACAN, LEYTE

1 **PRESENT:** (Please see attached Attendance Sheet, also attached are the lists of
2 personalities invited)
3

4 The proposed Ordinance submitted for public hearing is entitled "An Ordinance
5 Mandating All Meat and Fish Vendors to Display and Sell their Goods or Products
6 Only at Designated Area at the New Public Market in the Municipality of Inopacan,
7 Province of Leyte, Providing Penalties Thereof and for Other Purposes".
8

9 The public hearing started at 1:50 in the afternoon with an opening prayer through
10 computer audio and was immediately followed by the singing of the national anthem
11 synchronized with the computer audio.
12

13 The Secretary greeted and expressed due respect to the Municipal Mayor,
14 Honorable Rogelio D. Pua, Jr., for and on behalf of the 15th Sangguniang Bayan of this
15 Municipality headed by the Municipal Vice Mayor, Honorable Sanders C. Lumarda with all
16 the SB Members present, namely: Honorable Fernando B. Rulete, Honorable Andrew B.
17 Dedal, Honorable Zenaida G. de los Santos, Honorable Joel D. Bernales, Honorable Alfie
18 Jian B. Yamson, Honorable Daria D. Malanguis, Honorable Rowena K. Madrazo, Honorable
19 Diosdado P. Siao and Honorable Marianne B. Boldios. The Secretary then thanked the
20 participants for attending the public hearing and welcomed the Municipal Vice Mayor,
21 Honorable Lumarda for the Introduction of the above activity.
22

23 Honorable Sanders C. Lumarda, thanked everyone especially the meat and fish
24 vendors present, for the public hearing of the proposed Municipal Ordinance entitled "An
25 Ordinance Mandating All Meat and Fish Vendors to Display and Sell their Goods or
26 Products Only at Designated Area at the New Public Market in the Municipality of Inopacan,
27 Province of Leyte, Providing Penalties Thereof and for Other Purposes". He highlighted that
28 this Measure has been proposed for the benefit of all and the municipality in general. He
29 also encouraged the participants to listen, understand, participate and cooperate for the
30 matter.
31

32 Honorable Rogelio D. Pua, Jr., thanked the 15th Sangguniang Bayan for this
33 proposed Ordinance. For advance information, he announced that there are two (2)
34 proposed Ordinances but for the time being, the above Ordinance will be tackled first. And
35 the public hearing for the other one which is all about acquiring the stall/space and the rental
36 fees will be scheduled soon. For the above Ordinance mandating all meat and fish vendors
37 to display and sell their products only at the new public market, he recalled the history and
38 sort of experienced in the old market, when vendors preferred displaying products outside
39 the market for sales reasons. The Mayor explained further that with the establishment of the
40 new public market, calls a change from the old practice and that the establishment of the
41 new market shall serve its purpose, intended as wet market while the old one will now be
42 the dry market.
43

44 On his message, he emphasized to the participants that the Ordinance is in the
45 development process hence conducted this public hearing for comments and suggestions
46 from the concerned vendors, until come a time that this Ordinance will be enacted. To this,
47 the Mayor earnestly hoped for the vendors' unity, understanding and requested them to pay
48 respect to the Ordinance by adhering to it. Furthermore, he encouraged the vendors to open

49 up whatever observations and or suggestions for the improvement of the new market, and it
50 can only be done when the LGU Officials and the concerned vendors will work hand in hand
51 towards making Inopacan to be well-known for having plenty of products displayed/sold in
52 the new public market which will also encouraged people from neighboring towns to visit
53 and buy products displayed in the new public market. Also, he stressed on maintaining the
54 cleanliness of the area and the fact that operations will not be perfect at first, however, there
55 is always a room for improvement. He also informed the attendees that the problems being
56 seen are the water system and the electricity which there have been no separate meter for
57 each respective stall. Despite these, he advised the Authors of the above Ordinance to push
58 through this public hearing, following the other proposed Ordinance mentioned earlier, so
59 that the area will then be utilized and to find out the necessary improvements for the comfort
60 of the vendors. Meanwhile, the LGU will shoulder the water and electric bills, prior to the
61 installation of separate meters. On the other hand, the Mayor announced that there is an on-
62 going construction of some more additional stalls beside the new public market to showcase
63 the area as "one stop shop", providing/offering a comprehensive range of goods at one
64 location. To this, the Mayor brought up some questions raised during their initial
65 discussions, like refusal to display products at the new public market for the reason of
66 having a privately owned space/store and the legal basis of the LGU to ban displaying
67 his/her products at his/her own store/house. In response to this, the exemption will be
68 applied to those having a fully air-conditioned/enclosed area, not causing any foul smell
69 around, particularly, for meat shop (e.g., Monterey), which will be required upon acquiring
70 the business permit from the LGU. With that, the Mayor thanked everyone and hoping for
71 the support from all the participants as to the proposed Ordinance.
72

73 The Secretary thanked the Mayor for his message and highlighted that after the
74 discussion of the proposed Ordinance, which a copy of the same has been provided to each
75 one, there will be an open forum and that during the open forum, everyone is encouraged to
76 raise their questions and clarifications and prior to that, to introduce their selves for
77 recording purposes and so that their concerns and queries will be noted and well-taken.
78

79 Honorable Dedal, one of the Authors of the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance
80 Mandating All Meat and Fish Vendors to Display and Sell their Goods or Products
81 Only at Designated Area at the New Public Market in the Municipality of Inopacan,
82 Province of Leyte, Providing Penalties Thereof and for Other Purposes" gave an
83 introductory talk informing the participants that the Ordinance has been proposed because
84 of the newly established public market which aimed to accommodate all the meat and fish
85 vendors and at the same time, to provide a quality place for trade and commerce. Honorable
86 Dedal began his discussion by going over the entirety of the Ordinance translated into
87 cebuano/bisaya version, into details, to wit: Whereas, Title, Sections - which he
88 highlighted Section 4 - the Prohibited Acts to include the selling of wet products outside the
89 premises of the new public market and in places along Barangay Tao-Taon, Poblacion and
90 Tinago. Also, he emphasized that stationary vendors and ambulant vendors are two (2)
91 classification of vendors who will be allowed to sell wet products beyond the three (3)
92 barangays mentioned earlier, which intentionally and purposely keeping the distance so that
93 vendors in the new public market will not be affected. He also acknowledged the functions of
94 the BPLO and the MTO in Section 5. After the discussion, Honorable Dedal and the other
95 SB Members encouraged all the vendor participants to raise questions and clarifications.
96

97 Mr. Patricio Soliva, fish vendor, asked the effectivity of the proposed Ordinance.
98 Honorable Dedal replied that the Ordinance is on second reading to date, once enacted and
99 duly approved by the Municipal Mayor, that will be the effectivity then and its implementation
100 will be the Mayor's discretion. With the suggestions, reactions and recommendations, it will
101 be noted and be discussed with the Sanggunian in the next session and will be incorporated
102 into this Ordinance, prior to Third and Final Reading, ready for its enactment.
103

104 With the Information from Mayor Pua, Jr., Honorable Dedal informed the concerned
105 vendors that the target date of effectivity will be on September 18, 2022. However, the other

106 proposed Ordinance related to this one will also be taken into consideration. And that the
107 bills for water and electricity will be shouldered by the LGU while waiting for the installation
108 of the individual water and electric meters.
109

110 Mr. Edsil P. Oclinaria, meat vendor, posed a clarificatory question as to his existing
111 store (in the old public market) which he planned to comply with the requirements making it
112 qualified for meat shop. The Mayor's reply was that, since the Ordinance is mandating all
113 the wet market vendors, then he will then transfer to the new public market. The old public
114 market will then serve as the dry market soon. Mayor Pua, Jr. explained further that only
115 those with privately owned lots (e.g., Capangpangan) will be allowed for as long as they will
116 meet/comply the requirements, which currently, the LGU is seeking information from other
117 municipality (Baybay – e.g., Jollypig and the like) as to the standard qualification
118 requirements. As to the rate of fees for Class A meat shop, Honorable Rulate replied that
119 the rental fees will be tackled during the public hearing of the other Ordinance (to follow) and
120 the Mayor added that based on the Tax Code, there is no classification/category mentioned
121 with meat shops. Fees might vary depending on the capital declared and the BPLO
122 Designate – Mr. Gilbert L. Miranda added also that gross sales also matters.
123

124 Mr. Roy Rosales, fish vendor, raised his concern if all of them, more than thirty (30)
125 fish vendors would be able to acquire stall in the new public market. Honorable Dedal
126 replied positively since all in all, there are 48 stalls for meat and fish vendors. Also, he
127 added as to how to acquire stalls, it will then be fully addressed in the Ordinance governing
128 the use of stalls xxx. As to the question of Mr. Rosales on prohibiting the selling along Tao-
129 Taon, Poblacion and Tinago; Honorable Dedal answered in affirmative, particularly in public
130 places. As to if Brgy. Linao is allowed, Honorable Dedal explained that the query will be
131 noted and will be discussed by the Sanggunian, taking into consideration the opinion of
132 Honorable Bernales and the Mayor that Sitio Bacong-bacong is already within the premises
133 of Brgy. Linao, which is too near from the Poblacion. The Mayor added that Mr. Rosales
134 might mean, in the Pabahay and the latter replied in affirmative.
135

136 Mr. Antonieto D. Perandos, meat vendor, raised his query relative to his owned
137 lot/store in Brgy. Tinago, which he asked if it will be allowed that only his display area will be
138 air-conditioned and not the whole store area, he will just cover it with fiber glass or the like.
139 Honorable Dedal assured that the query is well-noted and that during either application or
140 renewal of the business permit, it will be based on the standard requirements set and the
141 inspection result to be conducted by the implementing Body – the BPLO and the Sanitary
142 Inspector, for the issuance of the same. As to the requirements, according to the Mayor, he
143 will be inquiring the same as basis for the setting of qualification standard. More views and
144 opinions relative to the requirements were aired, considering that Mr. Perandos was so
145 eager to know it so that he will be preparing his area the soonest possible time, to comply
146 with the same.
147

148 Ms. Joan Capangpangan, meat vendor, asked if this year, they will be allowed to
149 display/sell in their existing area. Mayor Pua, Jr. replied that once the standard requirements
150 will be set/finalized, the BPLO, Sanitary Inspector and the Engineering Office will be
151 evaluating the area and for the existing vendors, recommendations/adjustments needed as
152 well as the span of time for compliance will then be provided during the renewal of the
153 business permit, for those who wanted to operate outside the public market.
154

155 Mr. Edsil P. Oclinaria had an advance query as to the maximum number of stalls to
156 avail especially for him that more meat (beef, pork, carabao meat) will be displayed every
157 Sunday and he observed that individual stalls are smaller. Honorable Dedal replied that it
158 has not yet been stipulated in the Ordinance but the dimension of the stall is 1.9 meters by
159 1.2 meters, and as to the availment of more than 1 stall, he referred the query to the BPLO.
160 For the information and guidance of all the participants, the Honorable Mayor reiterated the
161 query of Mr. Oclinaria to avoid possible conflicts and issues relative the matter and he asked
162 the vendors if they are okay if there is/are vendor/s acquiring more than 1 stall in the new

163 public market. To this, Mr. Particio Soliva, fish vendor, asked it if it is also applicable to fish
164 vendors. Honorable de los Santos asked on the average and maximum quantity (kilograms)
165 of fish displayed daily. A fish vendor replied, maximum of 20 kgs. while others have nothing
166 to display. For his part, the Mayor is amenable to provide more than 1 stall for meat vendors
167 for as long as it is justifiable.
168

169 Mr. Garry Magno, fish vendor, lobbied his concern relative to strict implementation of
170 this Ordinance so that it would be fair enough for them who would religiously adhere of the
171 said Ordinance while others will, not especially those ambulant vendors and the like (e.g.,
172 *plato-plato, suroy-suroy*). The Mayor assured that aside from trying its best for a strict
173 implementation of this Ordinance, the Council at the same time, is requesting for the
174 cooperation from each and everyone by paying respect to this Ordinance. He added that
175 ambulant vendors will be allowed, outside the premises of the mentioned 3 barangays.
176

177 In relation to this, Mr. Edsil Oclinaria opened up regarding his long time and
178 usual/existing practice every Saturday on house to house delivery of his meat products.
179 Honorable Dedal replied that the affected clients/buyers are those in Tao-Taon and let the
180 Secretary note this concern. Some vendors said its okay since for them it has been a long
181 time practice. Moreover, Mr. Oclinaria informed the Honorable Body that they vendors really
182 need a freezer; hence, they also need a fix/designated area for the safety of the same and
183 he mentioned Baybay. The Honorable Vice Mayor, Honorable Sanders C. Lumarda
184 informed all the attendees that portion below the stalls in the new public market are not
185 suitable for freezer and he explained further the scenario/arrangement in the public market
186 of Baybay. To this concern, Honorable Dedal preferred to check the area first. Another
187 concern of Mr. Oclinaria is relative to their frozen products (e.g., hotdogs, longganisa, etc.)
188 because his sari-sari store will be at the old public market and he cited examples like the
189 department stores. Honorable Dedal has been referring to the Ordinance which it has been
190 covered as the by-products of meat, hence, it will be displayed in the new public market. As
191 discussions developed, the Mayor reiterate that Mr. Oclinaria has various of goods/products
192 and to this, he then informed that the building (under construction), with an area of 4x6,
193 beside the new public market is intended for the purpose. Views and opinions relative to the
194 design of the designated area for fish, vegetables, the CR were aired. The Honorable Mayor
195 further reiterated that problems are expected to arise when vendors will be selling/displaying
196 in the new public market. Hence, encouraged everyone to be opened on their concerns and
197 whatever complaints, the Office of the Municipal Mayor is very much willing to welcome and
198 will hear it out, to make some changes, if necessary, for improvement as well. And that
199 cooperation and working everything hand in hand will be the key so that all the vendors will
200 all be comfortable selling their products in the new public market.
201

202 With the mentioned under-construction building, Mr. Garry Magno manifested if it will
203 also be possible for fish vendors to avail the same if they could afford the rental fee. The
204 Mayor explained the difference between meat and fish as to its odor/smell, hence,
205 recommend that fish vendors will be at the new public market. Views and opinions were
206 aired.
207

208 Mr. Garry Magno, posed his concern with online sellers and if they themselves will
209 be requested by their buyers via phone call for delivery of fish products. The Mayor
210 reiterated that the LGU Officials request for all vendors' cooperation and to pay respect to
211 the other vendors selling inside the new public market, for the smooth implementation of the
212 Ordinance. And that online selling will be allowed outside the premises of the 3 mentioned
213 barangays. The Mayor explained in detail that this Ordinance is intended for the best
214 outcome of Fish and Meat industry in the municipality, and it will happen when all the
215 vendors will be united which will result to a higher sales; hence, everyone's cooperation
216 would be of great help for the purpose. Views and opinions were aired.
217

218 As to the concern of Mr. Edsil P. Oclinaria relative to meat vendors who by passed
219 the SOP as to slaughtering in the slaughterhouse, the Honorable Mayor replied the concern

is well taken and will be addressed soon for the welfare and protection of every vendor's right, especially those complying with the Municipal Ordinance.

As to fish supply, the Mayor would negotiate the fisherfolks to sell their fish catch to fellow Inopacnon fish vendors. Mr. Roy Rosales brought up those buyers who directly purchase fish cash at the fish port. Views and opinions were aired.

Mrs. Helen Dotarot, meat vendor, suggested that if a certain vendor has no products to display, to allow fellow vendors to display to his assigned stall, as a sort of internal agreement between vendors (just like in Bato, Leyte).

Another concern of Mr. Roy Rosales was the attitude of some vendors like grabbing of clients to the extent that clients either be hesitant to buy or being forced to buy products. He then suggested to imitate Bato, Leyte where vendors remain silent whenever clients are coming. To this, the Mayor recommend that all the products shall be displayed with price tag. As discussion developed, Honorable Siao posed a sort of negotiation with the fish and meat vendors not to feel bad if all of them vendors will not be bought with their products. Views and opinions were aired.


Another manifestation of Mr. Edsil P. Oclinaria is for the public vehicles (going to Plaridel and vice versa) to pass by/stand by at the new public market to also showcase the same.

Towards the end, the Municipal Mayor and the 15th Sangguniang Bayan is thankful for their presence, questions, clarifications and suggestions to help improve/develop and enhance the Ordinance.


Since there being no more other questions, Honorable Fernando B. Rulete, SB Member and one of the Authors of the Ordinances, delivered his closing remarks thanking all the participants for their sentiments and suggestions which will then be discussed by the LGU Officials.

The public hearing ended at 3:10 in the afternoon.
