



WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Tolosa, Leyte in session assembled is hereby amending Ordinance No. 3, S. 2017, Re: An Ordinance Enacting A New Market Code of the Municipality of Tolosa, Province of Leyte;

WHEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Edilberto R. Zabala, Jr., and duly seconded unanimously, be it;

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to Amend Ordinance No. 3. S. 2017, An Ordinance Enacting New Market Code of the Municipality of Tolosa, Province of Leyte;

ORDINANCE NO. 08 Series of 2022

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 3, SERIES OF 2017, RE: AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A NEW MARKET CODE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOLOSA, PROVINCE OF LEYTE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Tolosa, Leyte That:

TITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. This Ordinance shall be known as AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 3, SERIES OF 2017.

Section 2. COVERAGE.

- Provisions of this code shall govern the Establishment, Classification, Administration & Operation of the New Tolosa Public Market and the imposition, collection of market rental fees for occupancy thereof.
- b. To establish a self-reliant & viable eco enterprise, through the operation of the public market equipped with facilities for the services of the buying public.

Section 3. Definition of Terms. Whenever used in this code, the following terms shall mean:

- a. Ambulant/transient or Itinerant are those vendors who sell their merchandise by moving from one place to another and not occupying a permanent stall or space in the public market.
- Bagsakan refers to an open area, which serves as a service landing area for goods in h. bulks delivered by suppliers, producers and wholesalers.
- Board refers to Tolosa Public Market Board.
- Booth refers to two or more stalls enclosed for selling of merchandise or offering services to the public.
- Carrier or Kargadors refers to a person who for fee carries goods or merchandise from e. one place to another for the convenience of the vendors and customers.
- f. Charge - a pecuniary liability imposed against property or person/s in a form of rent or
- Cereals refers to rice, corn and other marketable and consumable grains. g.
- Cold storage refers to a place or piece of equipment where perishable goods are preserved and stored.
- Dealer means ones whose business is to buy and sell merchandise, goods and chattels Ì. as a merchant.
- Dry. Goods refers to all kinds of textiles, ready to wear (RTW, apparels, toiletries, novelties, laces, shoes, kitchen wares, utensils and other household articles, handbags and supplies of the same nature.
- Extension Area an area utilized by the stall/ space holder for the display of their goods or service to its customer beyond the original space covered by the lease.
- Lease refers to a written agreement through which the municipality of Tolosa conveys possession and occupancy for a specific period and rental of stalls or space.
- m. Lessee refers to a person having in his/her possession a duly executed contract of lease for specified rental, granted in his/her favor by the municipality of Tolosa, Leyte.
- Lessor refers to the Municipality of Tolosa or its authorized representative who transfer, conveys and assigns the temporary possession and occupancy of stalls/space or any portion thereof for a specified rental/fee and period by an agreement or lease of contract.
- License of Permit refers to a privilege or permission granted in accordance with the law or ordinance by an authority to engage in business, occupation or transactions.
- Market Premises any space in the market compound not covered by the market buildings.
- Market sections refers to classified stalls and spaces selling goods or offering services in same nature in a specified area.
- Market stalls refers to any specified and assigned area or booth in the public market where merchandize are sold or offered.
- Public Market refers to any space, building or structure of any kind owned and operated by Local Government of Tolosa, constructed/ repaired/rehabilitated for the purpose of providing space/ stalls where goods and services maybe sold or offered.
- Peddler refers to a person who, either for himself or on commission travels from one place to another in order to sell his goods.
- Rental Fee means a charge fixed by law.
- Stallholder refers to those granted the permission or privilege to occupy a stall/booth used to display goods or offer services.
- Support facilities refers to service areas provided, to support operations of the market including the Bagsakan, waste collection station, slaughterhouse, Comfort rooms.....
- Vendors person who sells goods, commodities and foodstuffs.

TITLE 2 – THE TOLOSA PUBLIC MARKET BOARD

Section 4. Creation - for the attainment of the objectives enunciated by this code, a body is hereby created which shall henceforth be known as the Tolosa Public Market Board.

Section 5. Composition – the board shall be composed of the following:

Section 6. Powers and Functions.

- Conduct drawing of lots in connection with the adjudication of vacant or newly constructed stalls or booth in the New Tolosa Public Market and award stalls to qualified applicants.
- Formulate policies, rules and regulations for market operations and administration b.
- Conduct periodic review of municipal market operations.
- Determine and fix market rates and fees at levels in order to render market operations economically viable and self-reliant.
- Hear and settle grievances arising out of market operations and administration.

Section 7. Term of Office - All members of the Tolosa Public Market Board shall hold office for the duration of the terms of the office to which they are appointed or elected. In case of The SB Representatives, they shall hold office for as long as they are still the chairperson of the respective SB Committee.

Section 7A. Term of Office - of the President of the Vendors association shall hold office for a 2 term 2 years only once re-elected.

Section 8. Meetings – The Tolosa Public Market Board shall have its regular meeting every first of the month, however the Chairman/Mayor may call a special meeting anytime for the purpose of taking up important or urgent matters upon request from any of its members.

Section 9. Excerpts of the Meeting. Results of the proceeding in every meeting must be fully documented and a copy shall be furnished to every member within 7 working days after each meeting held.

TITLE 3. SUPERVISION, ADMINISTRATION and ENFORCEMENT of the RULES and REGULATION.

Section 10. General Supervision and Control - The Municipal Mayor shall exercise general supervision, administration & control over the operations of Public Markets and the personnel compliment assigned therewith, including those whose duties concern the maintenance, upkeep of sanitation and peace and order in the market premises in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations of Tolosa Public Market Code.

Section 11. Collection of Fees and Charges. - It shall be the duty of the Municipal Treasurer or his/her authorized collection officer to collect fees and charges relevant to the provisions of the Market Code of 2017.

Section 12. Immediate and Direct Supervision - There shall be Market Administrator, who shall exercise all immediate and direct supervision and control over the operation of the public market and shall enforce all ordinances and regulations in all matters relative to the operations of the public market.

Section 13. Duties and Functions. - The Market Administrator shall:

- Implement and execute the plans and policies of the Board, in the operation of the public market, concerning sanitation, cleanliness, security and order with in the market premises.
- Supervise and evaluate the activities and performance of the market personnel, investigate all complains relative thereto, recommend to the Municipal Mayor for proper actions to be taken.
- Supervise, evaluate and administer market properties, including the acquisition, maintenance, utilization and disposal.
- d. Coordinate with the Municipal Treasurer on matters of collection and imposition of fees and charges.
- e. Recommend to the Public Market Board any matters necessary that shall make the market operations effective and efficient.
- Render monthly report to the Market Board.

Section 14. Enforcement of Rules and Regulations – the Municipal Mayor through the Market Administrator with the cooperation of the Municipal Treasurer shall have the authority to implement and enforce the Public Market Ordinance of 2017.

Section 15. These Market Rules and regulation shall apply to all market personnel/employees, arket vendors and the general public who engaged business within the New Tolosa Public Market.

Section 16. Business Permit Regulations. No entity shall be allowed to engage business within the premises of the New Public Market without securing permits and other mandatory requirements.

Section 17. All market vendors engaged in food handling must secure a Sanitary and Health permit every 6 months, likewise food servers are required to secure Health certificate.

Section 18. Prohibited acts by market vendors in the conduct of business:

- Selling of goods/commodities not in the designated area.
- Extensions beyond one meter space of the leased area and or utilizing pathways for display of b. goods.
- Short weighing and false measurement including tampering of weights and measuring scales. C.
- Bringing in motorcycles, bicycles, pushcarts inside the market building.
- Utilizing stall or market spaces as residence or living quarters.
- f. Littering and vandalism
- Improper use of comfort rooms, laundry washing and dish washing inside the toilet. g.
- Selling or transferring of privilege of leased stalls and spaces, allowing another person to take over his her leased space.
- Selling of illegal items/product and prohibited drugs.
- j. Selling of any kind of Firecrackers.

Section 19. Obligations, Duties and responsibilities of the Market Vendors:

- a. pay the necessary fees necessary fees, levied and collected by duly constituted authorities before using or taking possession of the bays assigned;
- comply with all sanitation rules and safety regulations which are promulgated by the duly constituted authorities and those that may be imposed by the municipality;
- require his/her employee to wear company uniform and ID's upon entering the premises of the public terminal (observe dress code and secure occupational permit);
- comply with laws, ordinances, regulations or orders of the National or Municipal Government authorities arising from or regarding the use, occupation and sanitation of the terminal premises.
- attend an Orientation on Terminal Operation and Customers Services with the drivers, bay and stall owners.
- Compliance to COVID 19 protocols and other emerging disease prevention and control.

Section 20. Terms and Conditions

USE OF MARKET SPACES

- 1. A mandatory one (1) months advance and one (1) months deposit in rental shall be collected from all commercial space concessionaires before award is granted;
- 2. Commercial stalls are deemed open to all interested concessionaires and shall be raffled.
- 3. Any person applying for the market stalls must submit a letter of intent addressed to the Mayor together with their business proposal;
- 4. A non-refundable Application Fee/Registration Fee of Php300,00 for all interested applicants shall be collected upon the submission of the letter of intent;
- 5. Fifteen days after the award, applicants must occupy immediately upon submission of current business permit and execute a contract of lease for the commercial space awarded to his right. A Certificate of Award duly approved by the Municipal Mayor shall be issued immediately for his occupancy:

- Municipal Treasurer shall assign a authorize collector to the Market for collection for a dayto-day basis;
- Collections of fees and other charges fees shall be paid directly to the Municipal Treasurers 7.
- TIME FOR PAYMENT AND PENALTIES FOR DELINQUENCIES the monthly rental of stalls and booths in the market shall become due and payable on or before the 21st day of every month. Failure to pay the rentals or fees within the period required herein shall subject the lessee/occupant to a surcharge of five (5%) percent of the amount due;
- VENDORS Only accredited vendors are allowed to sell goods in the terminal. A minimum fee of ₱20.00 shall be charged on a daily basis. Vendors are encouraged to sell locally, made products;
- 10. No fish vendor is allowed to market within the 500 meters radius from the market;

Section 21. Sanctions, Penalties for Violation - violations committed on any of these market rules and regulation and other existing laws and ordinance in relation the Public Market operations shall be lealt with in accordance with the following:

First Offense

A fine of ₱ 1,500.00 or one (1) hour community service.

2. Second Offense A fine of ₱ 2,000.00 and undergo seminar

3. Third Offense

A fine of ₱ 2,500.00 and suspension of business permit and termination of Lease Agreement.

Section 22. Wearing of Uniform and Identification Card. - all market personnel shall wear uniform and identification card.

Section 23. Recognition of Kargadors or carriers. - The recognition of the Kargadors/Carriers in the public market is for the convenience of the vendors and consumers alike is given importance in the New Tolosa Public Market operations. Carriers or Kargadors must secure a Registration Certificate and Identification Card, shall be provided through the Market Administrator upon paying a minimal fee of P 30.00 (thirty pesos) to cover the expense of ID card and Certificate. ID's must be worn while working as carrier/kargador, he must be a resident of Tolosa, Leyte, has not been convicted of any crime, must be 18 years of age.

Section 24. Special Provision - Market rules and Regulation shall be supple only to laws, rules and regulations, ordinances, resolutions and memorandum which govern the operations of the Tolosa Public Market.

TITLE 5 - Stall Adjudication

Section 25. Vacancy of Stalls, Booths and Vacant spaces of the newly constructed market building and other structure owned by the Municipality of Tolosa, shall be adjudicated to qualified applicants in the following manner.

NOTICE

Notice of vacancy of vacant stalls, booth or space shall be posted for period of not less than TEN (10) days prior to the date of awarding to qualified applicants. Notice shall be posted conspicuously at the vacant Stall/Booth at the Market bulletin Board and at the Municipal Building. It shall be written in a thick paper or any suitable material and shall be in the following form:

Section 31. Idle or Inactive stalls - any space that shall be idle for one (1) month for whatever reason shall be declared abandoned or vacant and shall be subject for bidding and awarded to qualified applicant.

Section 32. The municipality shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage, which stall holders may incur by reason of fire, theft or force majeure.

Section 33. It shall be the duty of the Market Administrator to exercise utmost vigilance and care prevent any loss in the municipal market. He/she shall have the authority to apprehend and turn over to the Police any person caught stealing of committing any offense and file appropriate legal actions.

Section 34. Extension of Stall Spaces – There shall be no extension of stall spaces other than those already covered by plans previously approved by the Board. However, areas utilized as extension for the display of the stallholders goods that do not obstruct the flow of traffic or the passage of the buying public may be allowed, provided that stallholder be charged double the rates based on a per square meter daily rate basis imposed on the area concerned in addition to the monthly rentals already imposed on the stalls where the extension was made. Extensions that obstruct the free passage of the buying public shall be removed. The market administrator must see to it that appropriate boundary markings shall be made to monitor and effectively implement the extension of stall charging.

TITLE 6. COLLECTION, ASSESSMENT AND PAYMENT OF STALL RENTALS AND MARKET FEES

Section 35. Direct and Immediate Supervision on Collections. – The Market Administrator or Market Collector shall exercise direct and immediate supervision, administration and control over the collection of all market fees as authorized by law (New Tolosa Public Market Code).

Section 36. Manner of Payment and Assessment of Rental Dues. - Rental dues shall be assessed in a daily basis regardless of the manner and term of payment. The Stallholder may pay their rent obligation on a daily, weekly or monthly basis at the option of the lessor.

Section 37. Imposition of Penalty and Interest. - Overdue or delinquent account on market stall rentals are hereby imposed a 25% penalty plus 2% monthly interest.

TITLE 7. OCCUPANCY PRIVILEGE and FEE

Section 38. Stall/Space occupants of the defunct Tolosa Public Market shall by way of raffle/drawing of lots be afforded first priority to occupy stall in the New Tolosa Public Market assigned in proper section by the LGU without need of participating in the bidding process. However, he/she shall pay a fixed Occupancy Fee herein prescribed before the stall is awarded to him/her. He/she is likewise obliged to pay the stall rental also provided herein. Previous delinquencies must also be paid. These occupants are not entitled to the Incentive as provided in the preceding Section. But must surrender also their stall once they cease to operate business. Otherwise, penalty herein provided shall be imposed upon them.

Section 41. Collection, Assessment and Payment of Space/Stall/Booth Rentals

- 41.1 DIRECT AND IMMEDIATE SUPERVISION ON COLLECTIONS The Market Administrator, Revenue Collection Clerk and/or Market Collector shall exercise direct and immediate supervision, administration and control over the collection of all market fees as authorized by law (Tolosa Market Ordinance of 2017).

Fees for Calibration, Sealing and Licensing of Weights and Measures Every person before using instruments of weights and measures within this municipality shall first have them sealed and licensed annually and pay therefore to the Municipal Treasurer the following fees: (refer to New Revenue Code 2016)

Section 55. Food Borne Animals. – These are group of animals (livestock and poultry products) enerally accepted for use as human food. Such animals include and are limited to the following:

Section 57. Confiscation and Disposition of Hot Meat and/or Illegally slaughtered Food Animals/Non-Food Animals. - Any and all hot meat or illegally slaughtered food/non-food animals sold and distributed within the territorial jurisdiction of Tolosa, Leyte shall be confiscated and forfeited in favor or the Municipal Government which shall in appropriate cases, be used as evidence in prosecuting any violation of this ordinance. Any hot meat or illegally slaughtered food animals found to be unfit for human consumption by the Municipal Veterinary Officer shall be, at the discretion of the Municipality, be sold for public consumption or donated immediately to orphanage, rehabilitation center/correctional institution or similar situation. Unfit meat and products and other non-food animals shall be condemned /disposed by the Municipal Veterinary Officer. A certificate of acknowledgement from these institution who accepted donated meat shall be submitted by Municipal Veterinary Officer to the Municipal Mayor's Office. Owner of the confiscated meat shall be furnished of this certificate. (in the absence of a Municipal Vetinerary the Sanitary office shall act as Municipal Vet)

Section 58. Accreditation of Private Abattoirs - The Municipal Mayor may, upon a resolution of the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality, acting on the recommendation of the Municipal Veterinary/Sanitary Officer accredit any private abattoir within its territorial jurisdiction but only for lechon suppliers and meat processors.

Any and all accredited private abattoirs shall be provided with Municipal Meat Inspectors; which the owner/operator will provide with a suitable place within the abattoir for easy, convenient and prompt meat inspection of the slaughtered animals. Slaughterhouse for lechon suppliers and meat processors with corresponding business permits and with facilities and operational procedures of minimum adequacy shall be allowed to apply for accreditation yearly; Periodic evaluation every 6 months by the Municipal Veterinary. Officer shall be required and such facilities and operational procedures shall be sanitarily maintained. Failure to meet sanitary standard shall cause the cancellation of permit/accreditation. There shall be imposed and collected and annual accreditation fee in the amount of ₱3,000.00 for any and all private slaughterhouse for meat processors operating within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Tolosa, Leyte. An inspection fee in the amount of P35.00 shall also be imposed for any and all hogs slaughtered in private slaughterhouse for lechon and meat processors.

Section 59. Registration and Licensing/Accreditation. - All meats handlers, butchers, meat vendors, meat dealers, meat processors and meat stall/shop operation who are involved in the orderly, safe and hygiene handling of meat and meat products shall be required yearly to register and apply for license/accreditation annually not later than January 20 of every year and thereafter. Civil Remedies for Collection of Revenues

Section 64. Municipal Government's lien. - Municipal taxes, fees, charges and other revenue! constitute a lien, superior to all liens, charges or encumbrances, in favor of any person, enforceable by appropriate administrative or judicial action, not only upon any property or rights therein which may be subject to the lien but also upon property used in business, occupation, practice of profession or calling, or exercise of privilege with respect to which the liens is imposed. The lien may only be extinguished upon full payment of the delinquent taxes, fees and charges including related surcharges and interest.

GENERAL PENAL PROVISIONS FINAL PROVISIONS

Section 65. Separability Clause - If, for any reason, any provision, section or part of this Code is declared not valid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect nor impair the remaining provisions, sections, or parts which shall continue to be in effect and enforced.

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Tolosa, Leyte in session assembled is hereby adopting Ordinance No. 3, S. 2017, An Ordinance Enacting A New Market Code of the Municipality of Tolosa, Province of Leyte;

WHEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Menardo M. Mate, and duly seconded unanimously, be it;

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to enact An Ordinance Enacting A New Market Code of the Municipality of Tolosa, Province of Leyte;

ORDINANCE NO. 03 Series of 2017

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A NEW MARKET CODE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOLOSA, PROVINCE OF LEYTE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Tolosa, Leyte That:

TITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. This Ordinance shall be known as THE NEW TOLOSA MARKET CODE OF 2017

Section 2. COVERAGE.

a. Provisions of this code shall govern the Establishment, Classification, Administration & Operation of the New Tolosa Public Market and the imposition, collection of market rental fees for occupancy thereof.

b. To establish a self-reliant & viable eco enterprise, through the operation of the public

market equipped with facilities for the services of the buying public.

Section 3. Definition of Terms. Whenever used in this code, the following terms shall mean:

- a. Ambulant/transient or Itinerant are those vendors who sell their merchandise by moving from one place to another and not occupying a permanent stall or space in the public
- b. Bagsakan refers to an open area, which serves as a service landing area for goods in bulks delivered by suppliers, producers and wholesalers.

Board - refers to Tolosa Public Market Board.

- Booth refers to two or more stalls enclosed for selling of merchandise or offering services to the public.
- e. Carrier or Kargadors refers to a person who for fee carries goods or merchandise from one place to another for the convenience of the vendors and customers.
- Charge a pecuniary liability imposed against property or person/s in a form of rent or

Cereals - refers to rice, corn and other marketable and consumable grains.

- h. Cold storage refers to a place or piece of equipment where perishable goods are preserved and stored.
- Dealer means ones whose business is to buy and sell merchandise, goods and chattels as a merchant.
- j. Dry Goods refers to all kinds of textiles, ready to wear (RTW, apparels, toiletries, novelties, laces, shoes, kitchen wares, utensils and other household articles, handbags and supplies of the same nature.
- k. Extension Area an area utilized by the stall/ space holder for the display of their goods or service to its customer beyond the original space covered by the lease.
- Lease refers to a written agreement through which the municipality of Tolosa conveys possession and occupancy for a specific period and rental of stalls or space.

m. Lessee - refers to a person having in his/her possession a duly executed contract of lease for specified rental, granted in his/her favor by the municipality of Tolosa, Leyte.

- n. Lessor refers to the Municipality of Tolosa or its authorized representative who transfer, conveys and assigns the temporary possession and occupancy of stalls/space or any portion thereof for a specified rental/fee and period by an agreement or lease of contract.
- o. License of Permit refers to a privilege or permission granted in accordance with the law or ordinance by an authority to engage in business, occupation or transactions.
- Market Premises any space in the market compound not covered by the market buildings.
- q. Market sections refers to classified stalls and spaces selling goods or offering services in same nature in a specified area.
- Market stalls refers to any specified and assigned area or booth in the public market where merchandize are sold or offered.
- Public Market refers to any space, building or structure of any kind owned and operated by Local Government of Tolosa, constructed/ repaired/rehabilitated for the purpose of providing space/ stalls where goods and services maybe sold or offered.
- t. Peddler refers to a person who, either for himself or on commission travels from one place to another in order to sell his goods.

Rental Fee – means a charge fixed by law.

- v. Stallholder refers to those granted the permission or privilege to occupy a stall/booth used to display goods or offer services.
- w. Support facilities refers to service areas provided, to support operations of the market including the Bagsakan, waste collection station, slaughterhouse, Comfort rooms.....

Vendors – person who sells goods, commodities and foodstuffs.

TITLE 2 - THE TOLOSA PUBLIC MARKET BOARD

Section 4. Creation - for the attainment of the objectives enunciated by this code, a body is hereby created which shall henceforth be known as the Tolosa Public Market Board.

Section 5. Composition – the board shall be composed of the following:

Section 6. Powers and Functions.

- Conduct drawing of lots in connection with the adjudication of vacant or newly constructed stalls or booth in the New Tolosa Public Market and award stalls to qualified applicants.
- b. Formulate policies, rules and regulations for market operations and administration
- c. Conduct periodic review of municipal market operations.
- d. Determine and fix market rates and fees at levels in order to render market operations economically viable and self-reliant.
- e. Hear and settle grievances arising out of market operations and administration.

Section 7. Term of Office – All members of the Tolosa Public Market Board shall hold office for the duration of the terms of the office to which they are appointed or elected. In case of The SB Representatives, they shall hold office for as long as they are still the chairperson of the respective SB Committee.

Section 7A. Term of Office - of the President of the Vendors association shall hold office for a 2 term 2 years only once re-elected.

Section 8. Meetings – The Tolosa Public Market Board shall have its regular meeting every first of the month, however the Chairman/Mayor may call a special meeting anytime for the purpose of taking up important or urgent matters upon request from any of its members.

Section 9. Excerpts of the Meeting. Results of the proceeding in every meeting must be fully documented and a copy shall be furnished to every member within 7 working days after each meeting held.

TITLE 3. SUPERVISION, ADMINISTRATION and ENFORCEMENT of the RULES and REGULATION.

Section 10. General Supervision and Control – The Municipal Mayor shall exercise general supervision, administration & control over the operations of Public Markets and the personnel compliment assigned therewith, including those whose duties concern the maintenance, upkeep of sanitation and peace and order in the market premises in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations of Tolosa Public Market Code.

Section 11. Collection of Fees and Charges. - It shall be the duty of the Municipal Treasurer or his/her authorized collection officer to collect fees and charges relevant to the provisions of the Market Code of 2017.

Section 12. Immediate and Direct Supervision – There shall be Market Administrator, who shall exercise all immediate and direct supervision and control over the operation of the public market and shall enforce all ordinances and regulations in all matters relative to the operations of the public market.

Section 13. Duties and Functions. - The Market Administrator shall:

- a. Implement and execute the plans and policies of the Board, in the operation of the public market, concerning sanitation, cleanliness, security and order with in the market premises.
- Supervise and evaluate the activities and performance of the market personnel, investigate all
 complains relative thereto, recommend to the Municipal Mayor for proper actions to be taken.
- c. Supervise, evaluate and administer market properties, including the acquisition, maintenance, utilization and disposal.
- d. Coordinate with the Municipal Treasurer on matters of collection and imposition of fees and charges.

e. Recommend to the Public Market Board any matters necessary that shall make the market operations effective and efficient.

f. Render monthly report to the Market Board

TITLE 4. MARKET RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 14. Enforcement of Rules and Regulations – the Municipal Mayor through the Market Administrator with the cooperation of the Municipal Treasurer shall have the authority to implement and enforce the Public Market Code of 2017.

Section 15. These Market Rules and regulation shall apply to all market personnel/employees, market vendors and the general public who engaged business within the New Tolosa Public Market.

Section 16. Business Permit Regulations. No entity shall be allowed to engage business within the premises of the New Public Market without securing permits and other mandatory requirements.

Section 17. All market vendors engaged in food handling must secure a Sanitary and Health permit every 6 months, likewise food servers are required to secure Health certificate.

Section 18. Prohibited acts by market vendors in the conduct of business:

- Selling of goods/commodities not in the designated area.
- b. Unauthorized extensions of space beyond the leased area and or utilizing pathways for display of goods.
- c. Short weighing and false measurement including tampering of weights and measuring scales.
- d. Bringing in motorcycles, bicycles, pushcarts inside the market building.
- e. Utilizing stall or market spaces as residence or living quarters.
- Littering and vandalism
- g. Improper use of comfort rooms, laundry washing and dish washing inside the toilet.
- h. Selling or transferring of privilege of leased stalls and spaces, allowing another person to take over his her leased space.
- Selling of illegal items/product and prohibited drugs.
- j. Selling of any kind of Firecrackers.

Section 19. Obligations, Duties and responsibilities of the Market Vendors:

- a. To secure permits and renew upon expiration.
- b. To pay promptly without demand his/her dues and other fees.
- To conveniently framed or hung proprietor's picture, permits inside the stall.
- To keep stalls/space in good sanitary condition at all times, must have a garbage can or receptacle with in his/her leased stall.
- e. To present and have their weighing scales calibrated and sealed at the Municipal Treasurers
- To pay dues, surcharges, fine and penalties accrued thereto.
- g. To secure a fire extinguisher upon order of the BFP if necessary.

Section 20. Sanctions, Penalties for Violation - violations committed on any of these market rules and regulation and other existing laws and ordinance in relation the Public Market operations shall be dealt with In accordance with the following:

1. First Offense

A fine of P 1,000.00 or one (1) hour community service.

Second Offense
 Third Offense

A fine of P 1,500.00 and undergo seminar

A fine of ₱ 2,000.00 and suspension of business permit and termination of Lease Agreement.

Section 21. Wearing of Uniform and Identification Card. - all market personnel shall wear uniform and identification card.

Section 22. Recognition of Kargadors or carriers. – The recognition of the Kargadors/Carriers in the public market is for the convenience of the vendors and consumers alike is given importance in the New Tolosa Public Market operations. Carriers or Kargadors must secure a Registration Certificate and Identification Card, shall be provided through the Market Administrator upon paying a minimal fee of P 30.00 (thirty pesos) to cover the expense of ID card and Certificate. ID's must be worn while working as carrier/kargador, he must be a resident of Tolosa, Leyte, has not been convicted of any crime, must be 18 years of age.

Section 23. Special Provision - Market rules and Regulation-shall be supple only to laws, rules and regulations, ordinances, resolutions and memorandum which govern the operations of the Tolosa Public Market.


Section 24. Vacancy of Stalls, Booths and Vacant spaces of the newly constructed market building and other structure owned by the Municipality of Tolosa, shall be adjudicated to qualified applicants in the following manner.

Section 25. Vacancy of Stall Before the Expiration of Lease - Should for any reason, stall holder or Lessee discontinue before the expiration of his/her lease, such shall be considered vacant and its occupancy thereafter shall be adjudicated in the manner herein prescribed.

Section 26. Lease Contract Agreement - For every stall awarded the successful applicants must sign a Contract of Lease and observe the terms and conditions of the code. Documentation shall be at the expense of the lessee. The contract shall be in the following form.



Section 31. The municipality shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage, which stall holders may incur by reason of fire, theft or force majeure.

Section 32. It shall be the duty of the Market Administrator to exercise utmost vigilance and care to prevent any loss in the municipal market. He/she shall have the authority to apprehend and turn over to the Police any person caught stealing of committing any offense and file appropriate legal actions.

Section 33. Extension of Stall Spaces – There shall be no extension of stall spaces other than those already covered by plans previously approved by the Board. However, areas utilized as extension for the display of the stallholders goods that do not obstruct the flow of traffic or the passage of the buying public may be allowed, provided that stallholder be charged double the rates based on a per square meter daily rate basis imposed on the area concerned in addition to the monthly rentals already imposed on the stalls where the extension was made. Extensions that obstruct the free passage of the buying public shall be removed. The market administrator must see to it that appropriate boundary markings shall be made to monitor and effectively implement the extension of stall charging.

TITLE 6. COLLECTION, ASSESSMENT AND PAYMENT OF STALL RENTALS AND MARKET FEES

Section 34. Direct and Immediate Supervision on Collections. – The Market Administrator or Market Collector shall exercise direct and immediate supervision, administration and control over the collection of all market fees as authorized by law (New Tolosa Public Market Code).

Section 35. Manner of Payment and Assessment of Rental Dues. – Rental dues shall be assessed in a daily basis regardless of the manner and term of payment. The Stallholder may pay their rent obligation on a daily, weekly or monthly basis at the option of the lessor.

Section 36. Imposition of Penalty and Interest. - Overdue or delinquent account on market stall rentals are hereby imposed a 25% penalty plus 2% monthly interest.

TITLE 7. OCCUPANCY PRIVILEGE and FEE

Section 37. Stall/Space occupants of the defunct Tolosa Public Market shall by way of raffle/drawing of lots be afforded first priority to occupy stall in the New Tolosa Public Market assigned in proper section by the LGU without need of participating in the bidding process. However, he/she shall pay a fixed Occupancy Fee herein prescribed before the stall is awarded to him/her. He/she is likewise obliged to pay the stall rental also provided herein. Previous delinquencies must also be paid. These occupants are not entitled to the Incentive as provided in the preceding Section. But must surrender also their stall once they cease to operate business. Otherwise, penalty herein provided shall be imposed upon them.

Section 38. The Fixed Occupancy Privilege Fee and Rentals. The OCCUPANCY AND RENTAL FEE for stalls of the New Tolosa Public Market and the vacant stalls/space of the New Tolosa Civic Center are as follows:

Section 40A. Vendors who acquired Stall/Tienda or Space and paid the corresponding occupancy fee who for one valid reason or another cease to operate his/her business shall surrender his/her stall to the LGU and upon presentation of documents, qualifies him/her a REFUND a portion of his occupancy fee as herein provided under the Refund Scheme.

Section 40B. Refund Scheme shall be in a following manner:

Section 40C. Business operators/stallholders who have availed of the refund incentive shall not be allowed to participate in any future bidding/acquisition for the occupancy of market stalls.

Section 41. Other Provisions.

- a.) Occupancy of stall shall strictly observe market rules and regulations specially payment of previous delinquency/ies otherwise, his/her privilege over the stall shall be forfeited and a penalty is imposed upon them.
- b.) Awarding of stalls to dislocated occupants of the burnt public market is limited only to one stall per awardee. Should he/she wish to acquire one more space/stall he/she may participate in the open bid and abide with the pertinent rules and regulations.
- c.) Tenants can avail a rebate of 10 % on monthly rental if paid before the due date.

- a) Dry goods section- refers to the area where dry goods like footwear's textiles, kitchen utensils, checherias, glassware, native products and school bags shall be sold.
- b) Eatery section refers to the area where carenderia, refreshment parlor, restaurant, cafeteria, panceteria, and other cooked and prepared foods shall be sold.
- c) Rice and corn section-refers to the area where rice, corn, feeds, hogmash, and other cereal shall be sold.

Section 43. Excess and Underpayment Stall Rentals. — Stall rental fees paid by the Stallholders in excess of what is imposed in this ordinance shall be credited and fully applied against future rental obligation and underpayment as a result thereof shall be considered deficiencies and shall be collected without penalty and interest.

Section 44. Toilet Fee — To regulate the sanitation and use of market comfort rooms, there is hereby imposed a fee of PhP5.00 for the use of the facility.

Section 45. Transient Vendors and Rolling Business — Transient vendors and roving salesmen shall not be allowed to do business in the public market unless they have secured first a Mayor's Permit Fee of P 100.00. The mayor's permit for transient vendors and salesmen shall be renewable on or before January 20th of each year.

Section 46. Fees for Calibration, Sealing and Licensing of Weights and Measures Every person before using instruments of weights and measures within this municipality shall first have them sealed and licensed annually and pay therefore to the Municipal Treasurer the following fees: (refer to New Revenue Code 2016)

TITLE 8. MEAT FOR PUBLIC CONSUMPTION AND REGULATION

Section 47. Food Borne Animals. – These are group of animals (livestock and poultry products) generally accepted for use as human food. Such animals include and are limited to the following:

- a.) Cattle;
- b.) Carabao/Buffalo;
- c.) Horse;
- d.) Goat/Sheep/Deer;
- e.) Hog; and
- f.) Poultry products such as Chicken, Turkey, Geese, Guinea, Fowl, Ducks and Quail

Section 48. Non-Food Animals. – The following are not generally accepted and recognized by law as human food and their sale prohibited:

- a.) Dogs;
- b.) Cats;
- c.) Monkeys;
- d.) Crocodiles/lizards;
- e.) Kangaroos; and
- f.) Rats/Bats/Snakes

Section 49. Confiscation and Disposition of Hot Meat and/or Illegally slaughtered Food Animals/Non-Food Animals. – Any and all hot meat or illegally slaughtered food/non-food animals sold and distributed within the territorial jurisdiction of Tolosa, Leyte shall be confiscated and forfeited in favor or the Municipal Government which shall in appropriate cases, be used as evidence in prosecuting any violation of this ordinance. Any hot meat or illegally slaughtered food animals found to be fit for human consumption by the Municipal Veterinary Officer shall be, at the discretion of the Municipality, be sold for public consumption or donated immediately to orphanage, rehabilitation center/correctional institution or similar situation. Unfit meat and products and other non-food animals shall be condemned /disposed by the Municipal Veterinary Officer. A certificate of acknowledgement from these institution who accepted donated meat shall be submitted by Municipal Veterinary Officer to the Municipal Mayor's Office. Owner of the confiscated meat shall be furnished of this certificate. (in the absence of a Municipal Vetinerary the Sanitary office shall act as Municipal Vet)

Section 50. Accreditation of Private Abattoirs — The Municipal Mayor may, upon a resolution of the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality, acting on the recommendation of the Municipal Veterinary/Sanitary Officer accredit any private abattoir within its territorial jurisdiction but only for lection suppliers and meat processors.

Any and all accredited private abattoirs shall be provided with Municipal Meat Inspectors; which the owner/operator will provide with a suitable place within the abattoir for easy, convenient and prompt meat inspection of the slaughtered animals. Slaughterhouse for lechon suppliers and meat processors with corresponding business permits and with facilities and operational procedures of minimum adequacy shall be allowed to apply for accreditation yearly; Periodic evaluation every 6 months by the Municipal Veterinary Officer shall be required and such facilities and operational procedures shall be sanitarily maintained. Failure to meet sanitary standard shall cause the cancellation of permit/accreditation. There shall be imposed and

collected and annual accreditation fee in the amount of \$\mathbb{P}3,000.00 for any and all private slaughterhouse for meat processors operating within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Tolosa, Leyte. An inspection fee in the amount of \$\mathbb{P}35.00\$ shall also be imposed for any and all hogs slaughtered in private slaughterhouse for lechon and meat processors.

Section 51. Registration and Licensing/Accreditation. - All meats handlers, butchers, meat vendors, meat dealers, meat processors and meat stall/shop operation who are involved in the orderly, safe and hygiene handling of meat and meat products shall be required yearly to register and apply for license/accreditation annually not later than January 20 of every year and thereafter. There shall be an annual fee for registration, licensing/accreditation for the following classification at the rates prescribed as follows:

1)	Meathandlers/cutters/butchers/helpers/vendors	P100.00	P 50.00
2)	Meat Stallholders (Public Market)	150.00	100.00
3)	Meat Shop Operator (Outside Public Market)	200.00	150.00

Section 52. Qualification and Requirements for Registration and Licensing/Accreditation. – Any person applying for a license as meat handler, butcher, meat vendor, meat dealer, meat processor, meat stall/shop operated or helper must possess the following qualifications:

- a.) He must be not less than 18 years old.
- b.) He must be free from tuberculosis and/or highly communicable deceases and a certificate from Municipal Health Office shall be secured prior to the filing of the application.
- c.) He must secure a police clearance prior to his application.
- d.) Meat dealer, meat stall/shop operators operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Municipality of Tolosa, Leyte, shall secure business permit prior to his/her application for licensing/accreditation.

Section 53. Slaughter Fees. – Subject to the provisions enunciated herein, there shall be collected for every head of animal slaughtered for human consumption the following fees:

TITLE 8. GENERAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

Civil Remedies for Collection of Revenues

Section 56. Municipal Government's lien. —Municipal taxes, fees, charges and other revenue constitute a lien, superior to all liens, charges or encumbrances, in favor of any person, enforceable by appropriate administrative or judicial action, not only upon any property or rights therein which may be subject to the lien but also upon property used in business, occupation, practice of profession or calling, or exercise of privilege with respect to which the liens is imposed. The lien may only be extinguished upon full payment of the delinquent taxes, fees and charges including telahed surcharges and interest.

GENERAL PENAL PROVISIONS

FINAL PROVISIONS

Section 57. Separability Clause - If, for any reason, any provision, section or part of this Code is declared not valid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgement shall not affect nor impair the remaining provisions, sections, or parts which shall continue to be enforce and effect.

Section 58. Repealing Clause - All ordinances, rules and regulations, or part thereof, in conflict with, or inconsistent with any provisions of this Code are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 59. Mandatory Increase. A Ten percent (10 %) increase shall be imposed on all stalls/booth every 5 years. Section 60. Mandatory Review. A review shall be done every 4 years upon approval of this Code.

Section 61. Effectivity – This Code shall take effect upon approval.
